



Title: Park Light Equipment Operator

FLSA Status: Non-Exempt

BRIEF DESCRIPTION:

The purpose of this position is to operate light equipment to repair streets, maintain parks grounds, and other City property. This is accomplished by keeping park grounds mowed and trimmed, maintaining baseball fields, repairing streets, curbs, and drains, and assisting with preparation for special events. Assist other departments as needed and perform other duties as needed including preparation of special events.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

2	M	Maintains all buildings and equipment by keeping public restrooms clean and in working order; ensuring all supplies are restocked; repairing sinks and water leaks; restoring damaged walls, roofs, and sidewalks; using a pressure washer to remove unwanted markings; tearing down and demolishing old buildings, fences, and concrete; installing new fences; repairing and maintaining fences; painting fences and buildings as needed; keeping inventory of equipment and equipment supplies; and resolving issues with equipment including radiators, tires, engines, spark plugs, fuses, belts, blades, and lights	45%

-Description of Minimum Job Requirements-	
Formal Education	Work requires knowledge necessary to understand basic operational, technical, or office processes. Level of knowledge equivalent to four years of high school or equivalency.
